

Why plan against terrorism?

There are obvious reasons why your business or organisation should plan to avoid terrorist acts, or at least to minimise their consequences.

These include:

Business continuity: ensuring that your business is able to cope with an incident or attack and return to normality as soon as possible;

Insurance: if you do not plan adequately, you may have to pay high premiums, or, in the worst case, you may not be able to get cover at all;

Legal obligations: the Health & Safety at Work Act 1974 puts the onus on the owner or occupier of the premises to safeguard the safety of staff and visitors. Whilst the police and other agencies may offer advice, the responsibility to seek that advice and act upon it lies with the owner or occupier. Remember that in the event of an incident, your plans are likely to come under scrutiny in any subsequent inquiries or court proceedings. Under such circumstances, you will want to demonstrate that your plans took the relevant legislation into account.
